The vowels and consonants in the transliterated Greek should be sung as in Italian. Especially in the first part of the piece, each part usually only sings one syllable of a word, with entries staggered so that the entire word is sung. I have used hyphens and punctuation to indicate these "orphan" syllables (i.e. for the word "Wanassa," "Wa-," is the first syllable; "–nas–," is the second; and "–sa." is the third).
